Ex-Sportscaster Pete Liebengood, President of OnQCo, was elected President of the Redwood City Rotary Club, succeeding chiropractor Paul Picocone. Liebengood will lead the club, whose motto is: "Fun People Doing Great Things for Redwood City, and the World" in its 65th year of operation.

"This year, as a community service, we are planning something quite new and exciting -- a film festival for youth, which will be held September 23rd at the Fox Theater," Liebengood announced at his inaugural meeting. "We intend this festival to raise funds to support a new media center for the youth of our community."

"We also will continue to provide college scholarships, international relief, and many other hands-on projects that benefit the people of Redwood City, he added.

Organized criminals will rent houses and turn them into marijuana farms. They steal electricity, worth \$440 per day, to provide the sodium "grow lights" to raise the plants. Marijuana is not the only problem. Methamphetamine, heroin, ecstasy all create addicts. Leo told us that the Task Force has a van used to entertain children that may be in a house when a drug bust is happening. The idea is to remove the children from the tense scene inside and keep them otherwise occupied while their parents are being questioned. Leo stressed education as the means to end drug abuse.



His concept is to take textbook material and make it available online. He wants textbook publishers to be paid for educational content and not for bound up paper.


Curriki.org provides an exciting method of teaching with real time scoring. Students can access the material and then take an online test to see how well they have absorbed the lesson being taught.

Scott observed that California, where everyone is a victim, is leading the charge to insolvency. He is tired of inconvenient truth and states we should be looking for inconvenient solutions. Government is too big and needs to be trimmed.

Rotary International and its partners are in the home stretch

WHEN ROTARY International trained its sights on eradicating polio in the late 1980s, the disease was active in 120 countries. Today, after more than 2 billion children have been immunized against the polio virus in the past 20 years, the disease is endemic in only four countries—Afghanistan, India, Nigeria and Pakistan. Its occurrence has been effectively cut by 99 percent.

Epidemic outbreaks of polio caused panic in the U.S. during the 1940s and '50s, leaving thousands of children crippled. In the six years after World War II, new cases averaged 27,000 each year, with that number peaking at nearly 60,000 in 1952. But the development of two effective vaccines turned the tide so that, by 1979, polio had been virtually eliminated in the U.S.

Polio is spread by human contact; people infected by the virus don't always get sick but can still spread it to others of any age. Most frequently, children under 3 years of age are infected.

Less than 1 percent of cases result in paralysis, and less than 10 percent of that group may die when the paralysis affects the muscles used in breathing.

Rotary International, a global humanitarian service organization, has some heavy-weight partners in waging this campaign, including the World Health Organization, UNICEF and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention—collectively teamed in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI).

As the volunteer arm of the GPEI, Rotary focuses on fundraising, advocacy and mobilizing volunteers. Rotary's PolioPlus program

has raised and contributed more than \$900 million toward eradication, and Rotary's 1.2 million members in more than 200 countries actively spread the word and continue to do the work necessary for success.

A recent fundraising windfall came from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, which announced a contribution of \$355 million, with Rotary to raise \$200 million in matching funds by June 2012.

John Matthews, senior vice president of human resources for Costco, was active in Rotary when the campaign started, and remembers how immense the goal seemed.

"In the history of mankind, we have only eradicated one disease—smallpox—from our planet; polio will be the second," says John, currently a Rotary district governor in the Pacific Northwest. "Now that we've almost reached the goal to eradicate polio, the takeaway is

that we are all a lot smarter today about how to tackle tough global health issues, which can only benefit us as we tackle the next global health challenge."

The vigilance can't let up with just being close to the goal, or even when the goal is reached. Polio can and must be totally eliminated, and each new generation will require vaccination to keep the lid on this virulent disease so it can't regain a foothold.

Family meant a lot to Bob. He was born in Laton California, the youngest of six children but the first of his siblings to be born in California. His parents, Ray and Minnie Dooley brought the family to California from Oklahoma, to seek a better life in the farming regions of the central valley. Mike alluded to a future fine/recognition session based on Italian Opera.

Megan Delehanty, Mt. Everest conqueror, shared her experience of climbing the highest mountain. She has ascended five of the highest mountains on each continent in the world and has two, Antarctica & Pacifica, to go. Megan showed us pictures of her two tries to climb Everest. She first attempted to make the ascent from the North, through Tibet (China), but was unsuccessful. Later she joined a larger "commercial group" and was

successful in reaching the top. In making the climb, base camp is at 17,500 feet; camp 2 is at 21,000 feet; camp 3 somewhere above that and camp 4 "the death zone" is at 26,000. Before setting off the Sherpa guides conduct a Puja ceremony to invoke the help of the Buddha in obtaining success. The most dangerous part of the trip is transversing the Icefall, where the climbers leave at 1:00 AM hoping the ice is stable and use ladders to span crevasses. After crossing South Summit, a precarious, narrow trail with a drop of 6,000 feet on one side and 8,000 on the other, she reached the Hillary Step at 28,700 feet; from there it's a cakewalk to the top. Megan told us reaching the summit did not evoke an emotional response, that came later, and that the descent was far more dangerous than the climb up.

Global eradication of polio?

Rotary International and its partners are in the home stretch

WHEN ROTARY International trained its sights on eradicating polio in the late 1980s, the disease was active in 120 countries. Today, after more than 2 billion children have been immunized against the polio virus in the past 20 years, the disease is endemic in only four countries—Afghanistan, India, Nigeria and Pakistan. Its occurrence has been effectively cut by 99 percent.

Epidemic outbreaks of polio caused panic in the U.S. during the 1940s and '50s, leaving thousands of children crippled. In the six years after World War II, new cases averaged 27,000 each year, with that number peaking at nearly 40,000 in 1952. But the development of two effective vaccines turned the tide so that, by 1979, polio had been virtually eliminated in the U.S.

Polio is spread by human contact; people infected by the virus don't always get sick but can still spread it to others of any age. Most frequently, children under 3 years of age are infected.

Less than 1 percent of cases result in paralysis, and less than 10 percent of that group may die when the paralysis affects the muscles used in breathing.

Rotary International, a global humanitarian service organization, has some heavy-hitting partners in waging this campaign, including the World Health Organization, UNICEF and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention—collectively named in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI).

As the volunteer arm of the GPEI, Rotary focuses on fundraising, advocacy and mobilizing volunteers. Rotary's PolioPlus program

has raised and contributed more than \$900 million toward eradication, and Rotary's 1.2 million members in more than 200 countries actively spread the word and continue to do the work necessary for success.

A recent fundraising windfall came from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, which announced a contribution of \$355 million, with Rotary to raise \$200 million in matching funds by June 2012.

John Matthews, senior vice president of human resources for Costco, was active in Rotary when the campaign started, and remembers how immense the goal seemed.

"In the history of mankind, we have only eradicated one disease—smallpox—from our planet; polio will be the second," says John, currently a Rotary district governor in the Pacific Northwest. "Now that we've almost reached the goal to eradicate polio, the takeaway is

that we are all a lot smarter today about how to tackle tough global health issues, which can only benefit us as we tackle the next global health challenge."

The vigilance can't let up with just being close to the goal, or even when the goal is reached. Polio can and must be totally eliminated, and each new generation will require vaccination to keep the lid on this virulent disease so it can't regain a foothold.






David Reilly, principal of Woodside High School presented our program. He discussed the school's participation in the documentary *Waiting*





After joining the FBI, she spent 16 of her 21 service years in Washington D.C. She was transferred to San Francisco in 2005 and was appointed Agent in Charge in 2009.

Stephanie related how crime has evolved from the Chicago mob era to the modern concern of terrorism, cyber crime, child pornography over the internet, white collar crime, public corruption and violent gangs. One of the newest scams (not new, bur newly reinvented) has to do with scams of people whose homes are in foreclosure



Valid Searches and Seizures Without Warrants

While the Supreme Court stresses the importance of warrants and has repeatedly referred to searches without warrants as "exceptional,"¹ it appears that the greater number of searches, as well as the vast number of arrests, take place without warrants. The Reporters of the American Law Institute Project on a Model Code of Pre-Arrest Procedure have noted "their conviction that, as a practical matter, searches without warrant and incidental to arrest have been up to this time, and may remain, of greater practical importance" than searches pursuant to warrants. "[T]he evidence on hand . . . compel[s] the conclusion that searches under warrants have played a comparatively minor part in law enforcement, except in connection with narcotics and gambling laws."² Nevertheless, the Court frequently asserts that "the most basic constitutional rule in this area is that 'searches conducted outside the judicial process, without prior approval by judge or magistrate, are per se unreasonable under the Fourth Amendment--subject only to a few specially established and well-delineated exceptions.'³ The exceptions are said to be "jealously and carefully drawn,"⁴ and there must be "a showing by those who seek exemption . . . that the exigencies of the situation made that course imperative."⁵ While the record does indicate an effort to categorize the exceptions, the number and breadth of those exceptions have been growing.

Detention Short of Arrest: Stop-and-Frisk .-- Arrests are subject to the requirements of the Fourth Amendment, but the courts have followed the common law in upholding the right of police officers to take a person into custody without a warrant if they have probable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed a felony or has committed a misdemeanor in their presence.⁶ The probable cause is, of course, the same standard required to be met in the issuance of an arrest warrant, and must be satisfied by conditions existing prior to the policeman's stop, what is discovered thereafter not sufficing to establish retroactively reasonable cause.⁷ There are, however, instances when a policeman's suspicions will have been aroused by someone's conduct or manner, but probable cause for placing such a person under arrest will be lacking.⁸ In *Terry v. Ohio*,⁹ the Court almost unanimously approved an on-the-street investigation by a police officer which involved "patting down" the subject of the investigation for weapons.

The case arose when a police officer observed three individuals engaging in conduct which appeared to him, on the basis of training and experience, to be the "casing" of a store for a likely armed robbery; upon approaching the men, identifying himself, and not receiving prompt identification, the officer seized one of the men, patted the exterior of his clothes, and discovered a gun. Chief Justice Warren for the Court wrote that the Fourth Amendment was applicable to the situation, applicable "whenever a police officer accosts an individual and restrains his freedom to walk away."¹⁰ Since the warrant clause is necessarily and practically of no application to the type of on-the-street encounter present in *Terry*, the Chief Justice continued, the question was whether the policeman's actions were reasonable. The test of reasonableness in this sort of situation is whether the police officer can point to "specific and articulable facts which, taken together with rational inferences from those facts," would lead a neutral magistrate on review to conclude that a man of reasonable caution would be warranted in believing that possible criminal behavior was at hand and that both an investigative stop and a "frisk" was required.¹¹ Inasmuch as the conduct witnessed by the policeman reasonably led him to believe that an armed robbery was in prospect, he was as reasonably led to believe that the men were armed and probably dangerous and that his safety required a "frisk." Because the object of the "frisk" is the discovery of dangerous weapons, "it must therefore be confined in scope to an intrusion reasonably designed to discover guns, knives, clubs, or other hidden instruments for the assault of the police officer."¹² If, in the course of a weapons frisk, "plain touch" reveals presence of an object that the officer has probable cause to believe is contraband, the officer may seize that object. *Supp.*³ The Court viewed the situation as analogous to that covered by the "plain view" doctrine: obvious contraband may be seized, but a search may not be expanded to determine whether an object is contraband. *Supp.*⁴

Pipeline Construction is Underway


Construction of Bay Division Pipeline No. 5 Peninsula (BDPL5 Peninsula) is ongoing in Redwood City and Menlo Park. Crews have installed over a mile of pipe between Woodside Avenue and Alameda de las Pulgas in Redwood City, and are on target to complete critical work in several schools this summer. Crews will be working west towards Emerald Hills and east towards North Fair Oaks later this summer and into Fall. Next year crews will be working in East Palo Alto and in other areas in Menlo Park.

With the exception of major highways, some intersections and railroad crossings, open trenching will be used at most street crossings. Some smaller streets will be closed during construction hours. Residents should always use caution when traveling around construction sites.

The SFPUC and its contractors will work to ensure that noise and dust are kept to a minimum; however,

some disruptions are to be expected due to the nature of construction. With few exceptions, work will be conducted in SFPUC owned land. In most areas, construction will take place Monday through Friday and will adhere to local work hours and noise ordinances. Night and weekend work may be necessary in some areas. Neighbors impacted by night work will be notified in advance.

You will continue to receive updates as construction gets closer to your community.

Keeping the Right of Way Clear and Safe

With construction beginning, it is essential that SFPUC's Right of Way (ROW) is clear for crews and equipment. If you live adjacent to SFPUC property, please remove any materials, vegetation, or debris from the ROW as soon as possible. There will be no public access to the ROW during construction.

The SFPUC's Real Estate Services Division has distributed permits to neighbors who live on SFPUC land. Following construction, the permits will allow you to use your SFPUC yard and driveway for landscaping or driveway apron. Under permits, all ROW lands are subject to the SFPUC Vegetation Management Policy.

Thank you for working with us to keep the ROW clear and safe.

There may be a cut in service to fill a \$30 Million deficit unless adequate sources of funding are found. There is hope, if the system can be electrified and new signaling systems are installed, however, it all depends on funding.

High-speed rail could have a transformational effect on urban mobility, motivating cities to improve feeder public transit lines and diversifying transit options.

“As demand increases, if we do not have high-speed rail, we will continue to rely on automobile and air travel for our long-distance needs,” Daganzo said, speaking at a UC Berkeley Institute of Transportation Studies (ITS) symposium last fall. “Now is the time to start, even though high-speed rail may run deficits for some years.” Government will need to subsidize ticket prices to motivate passengers to switch from air and auto travel, he explained, and upfront costs will be high. But the financial and environmental cost of energy to run the trains—electricity rather than fossil fuels—would be lower and more stable over time than continuing to build and use new roads and airports.

The infrastructure required is massive. High-speed rail systems use light, aerodynamic cars, steel wheels on steel tracks and dedicated lines with no sharp turns and little cross traffic. New tracks must be laid. At grade crossings they must either be elevated or tunneled to preserve the high-speed train’s right of way. Trains will slow down as they approach major cities, but on the high-speed segments secure fences are needed to keep people and animals off the tracks. New power supply stations must be built to provide electricity. In California, of course, everything must meet seismic code.

Current plans call for phase one to begin construction by fall 2012 and finish by 2020, connecting San Francisco to Los Angeles via the Central Valley. Later phases will extend north to Sacramento and south to San Diego. According to the CHSRA website, construction will be one-half the cost of expanding highways and airports to the same capacity. The system will create 160,000 construction-related jobs and, by 2035, 450,000 permanent jobs to support the 800 miles of track, multiple train lines and 24 stations.

Not so fast

The bad news is that construction will take 10 years, and many painstaking details have yet to be resolved. Even those who support high-speed rail express growing concern that early projections and promises about ticket prices and funding, which helped gain voter approval in 2008, are not holding up.

In January, the Legislative Analyst’s Office, California’s nonpartisan fiscal and policy advisory body, identified several flaws in the project’s 2009 business plan, including its projections for cost, ridership and revenues. In this latest plan, earlier CHSRA projections were adjusted upward: one-way fare between SF and LA, which was to cost \$55, will now cost \$105; and overall project cost ballooned from \$33.6 billion to \$42.6 billion, against which California’s federal stimulus funding of \$2.25 billion is pocket change.

Founded in Chicago in 1905 as the world's first volunteer service organization, Rotary quickly expanded around the globe. Clubs meet weekly for fellowship to discuss local and global topics. Clubs are nonreligious, nongovernmental, and open to every race, culture, and creed.

Our program was presented by Dr. Judith London, a psychologist and author of a book dealing with Alzheimer's disease and how "care givers" may respond and work with patients, Judy said that people diagnosed with "dementia" live in the moment and we need to recognize this if we are the care giver. The term "Dementia" is being phased out and replaced with more specific terms such as cognitive failure, stroke and Alzheimer's. Normal aging involves some forgetfulness (that lets many of us off the hook), but there is a state of "Mild cognitive impairment" that involves more than normal aging and than there is Alzheimer's, a deterioration of the brain. Judy suggests that if we have a friend or relative with the disease, we need to sharpen our communication skills and be sure we are heard and seen, We need to smile and not ask specific question that are too easily answered with a "NO!" She stresses connection and communication.


Following the business meeting, we were invited by Pres. Pete to go upstairs and check out the Fresh Takes facilities with an onsite tour.
